Workshops 2016

- **A.** America's Civil War Heroes: Joe DeBell (session one: k-5 & session two: 6-12) Travel back in time to meet heroes of the Civil War! Role play what it was like to be a Civil War soldier in the 1860's, and check out some Civil War themed comic books.
- **B.** <u>Holy Costumes, Batman!</u>: Jazmyn Palermo & Jessica Cheng (session one: k-5 & session two: 6-12) Create a superhero and design your own costume. Learn the incredible history of superhero costuming!
- **C. <u>Join the Comic Con Band:</u>** George Hochbruecker (session one: k-5 & session two: 6-12) Play in a band with cool instruments and real musicians! Create comic book themed songs and perform them in the band!
- **D. <u>So You Want to Create a Super Hero!</u>**: George Casden (session one: k-5 & session two: 6-12) What are superheroes? What do they look like? Learn basic cartooning and drawing techniques to create the superhero you want!
- **E.** <u>Godzilla! Weapon of Mass Destruction!</u>: Josh DeBell (session 1: 6-12 & session 2: k-5) Meet Godzilla "King of the Monsters", through movie clips, novels, comics, video games, and even a Godzilla board game.
- **F.** <u>Comic Books Galore!</u>: Lenny Palermo (session one: 6-12 & session two k-5) Are you interested in collecting comic books and comic book memorabilia? Learn how to find the value of comic books and enjoy handling part of a huge collection!
- **G.** <u>Superheroes of Musical Imagination</u>: Ted Canning (session1 : 6-12 & session 2: 6-12) Find out how musical creativity saved the people of Trinidad from gangs and racism. Play music on real steel drums, and learn about how they were invented by teens.
- H. What If? How to Come Up with Ideas and Make Comics: Dan Hosek (k-12) A brief introduction to the various "jobs" involved in making a comic: writing the story, the art (pencil, inks, and coloring) and lettering. We'll create our own comics by asking, "What if?" to create story ideas.

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
